



Notification - 2006 Parking Permit/Sticker Fee and Monthly Reserved Parking Charge Increases

I. NYCHA Parking Permit/Sticker Fees

- Effective April 1, 2006, the annual fee for a NYCHA parking permit/sticker for both **reserved** and **non-reserved** parking will increase as follows: **\$75.00 (\$67.50 for Senior Citizens and the disabled)** for NYCHA residents only and \$150.00 for non-residents.

II. Monthly Charges for Reserved Parking

- Monthly recurring charges for reserved parking spaces will also be increased effective April 1st. The new monthly charges will include a 10% discount for seniors and the disabled who are Authority residents. For NYCHA residents, these charges will be included in your rent statements. The new fees are as follows:

Type of Parking	2006 Resident Charge	2006 Non-Resident Charge
Monthly Outdoor Reserved	\$20.00*	\$35.00*
Monthly Indoor Reserved	\$35.00*	\$75.00*

* In addition to the above charges a 10.5% New York State Parking Tax will be added. For non-Manhattan residents who park at Manhattan developments; the applicable parking tax is 18.5%.

- There will continue to be no monthly charge for non-reserved parking for residents and non-residents. However, a parking permit/sticker is required.

III. Replacement of Parking Permits/Stickers

Fees for replacement parking permits/stickers for residents and non-residents are as follows:

- Lost parking permit/sticker (Police Report submitted) - \$25.00
- Stolen parking permit/sticker (Police Report submitted) - No charge
- Replacement parking permit/sticker (Old sticker returned) - No charge

IV. Application Process

Each year you must apply for a permit/sticker for both **reserved** and **non-reserved parking**. Please submit a Money Order and copies of the following documents when applying:

- A completed Parking Permit Application, which can be obtained from your Management Office
- A copy of your current New York State Vehicle Registration, i.e., passenger, commercial or motorcycle, showing that the vehicle is registered to the resident's development address
- Insurance card showing that the vehicle owner maintains insurance in accordance with New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law
- A New York City or New York State Parking Permit for Persons with Disabilities, if applying for a parking space designed for persons with disabilities
- A copy of a valid ID showing proof of age for Senior citizens 62 years of age or older
- During the first two weeks of April, development staff will accept parking permit/sticker applications from prior permit holders only. The application process for new permits/stickers will begin **April 3rd**. The development staff will **not** issue a parking permit/sticker unless the correct fee and all applicable documents have been submitted. Payment for the permit/sticker must be made in full with a Money Order payable to "New York City Housing Authority." No other form of payment will be accepted.
